## Post Operative Instructions After Crown/Bridge Prep, Veneer's, & Inlay/Onlay's

## Temporary Crown/Bridge:

- 1. Following the first appointment for a crown or bridge procedure, a temporary crown/bridge will be placed on the tooth or teeth involved. This will protect them while the permanent restoration is being made.
- 2. A universal shade will be used to create the temporary that serves as a cosmetic and protective function. Your final restoration will be shaped and shaded better than the temporary to match your other teeth in both color and function.
- **3.** The use of temporary cement is for easy removal on your next appointment. If your temporary comes off/breaks between appointments, call us for a quick appointment to have it put back on. To help ensure that the temporary does not come off, avoid sticky and hard/crunchy foods.
- **4.** After the anesthetic wears off, if you feel the bite is not correctly balanced be sure to call our office immediately for a simple adjustment of your temporary.
- **5.** Proper care of the temporary includes brushing as normal and flossing (pull the floss out to the side instead of popping it upward as this can dislodge the crown)

## Permanent Crown/Bridge:

- 1. Many crowns fit below the gum line, therefore you may experience some discomfort for a few days due to the irritation of that area during the procedure. The discomfort should improve in a day or two. Rinsing with warm salt water 2-3 times/day will help the gums heal more quickly.
- 2. Sensitivity to cold or pressure is also possible. Sensitivity to hot/cold lasting a couple seconds is normal after dental treatment.
- 3. Proper care of your new crown/bridge includes brushing twice/day and flossing before bed (if your new restoration is a bridge, we will send you home with floss threaders to floss under your bridge which should be done daily)
