ADENOIDECTOMY & VENTILATIONS TUBE INSERTION PATIENT POST-OPERATIVE INSTRUCTIONS

FOLLOW UP VISITS: The follow up visit will be in three weeks following the

procedure.

ACTIVITY: No strenuous activity for 24 hours if adenoidectomy

performed. No water in the ears until first post-op visit if ventilation tubes were inserted. You may use a cotton ball with Vaseline or pre-molded ear plugs. Once the ears have healed it will be safe to swim in a pool or wash hair with tap water. There is an increased risk of infection with swimming In non-chlorinated water such as the ocean or bay. Putting your head in dirty bath water may also lead to infection.

DIET: Normal diet.

PAIN: Take Tylenol or any aspirin-free medication every four hours,

as needed. There is minimal pain involved. There may be bad breath for the first 1 - 2 weeks due to scabs forming where

the adenoids were.

TEMPERATURE: Note any temperature elevation. Drink lots of cool liquids. If

temperature is over 101 degrees orally AND DOES NOT

RESPOND TO MEDICATION, increase fluids and call the office.

GENERAL: There is usually a bad odor to the breath until healing has

occurred. It does not mean infection. Brushing your teeth and tongue, as well as gently rinsing with mild salt water several times a day may be helpful. Adenoidectomy patients should not blow their nose for approximately five days. Increased mucous production is normal and part of the healing process. Use the ear drops as directed at least for three days or longer if drainage

persists. Whenever there is drainage from the ears, it is important to use the drops to prevent obstruction of the tubes

and also to clear the infection.
